

## **HERITAGE PARK**

Located at 193 Rifle Range Road Pimpama (Use Exit 49 from the M1 Motorway) our site was originally an old rifle range (some of the target structures are still visible). The land was originally owned by the Commonwealth of Australia and then acquired by the Albert Shire Council for a nominal amount. The South Coast Restoration Society Inc (SCRS) signed a thirty year lease over the site on 1<sup>st</sup> January 1992 with the Albert Shire Council. The local government area has since come under the control of The Gold Coast City Council. The South Coast Restoration Society Inc acknowledges the continuing support of The Gold Coast City Council and our Division One Councillor Donna Gates. The site covers an area of some 34 hectares and has seen significant improvements made by the SCRS over the years. A number of other organisations use the site with the SCRS. Guanaba Country Music Club have created a club house based in what was the original Beenleigh Fire Station Building. The Krawarree Project Inc also display a WWII Ex-Army Ambulance Launch AH1733 known as the 'Krawarree'.

## **SCRS-MEETINGS**

Membership of the South Coast Restoration Society Inc is encouraged. The Society holds General Meetings at Heritage Park on the FORTH MONDAY OF THE MONTH (except December) commencing at 7.30pm.

## **SCRS-OPEN DAYS**

The SCRS has numerous displays at Heritage Park. Some are created by the Society as a whole, one of these being the 'Engine Shed' which houses a large collection of Stationary Engines, Tractors and Trucks. Members of the SCRS also put on their own displays in twenty separate sheds. On the SECOND SUNDAY OF THE MONTH all displays are opened for the public to view. We are open from 10am until 3pm. ENTRY IS FREE. Visitors can also experience joyrides in historic buses which will take you around Heritage Park. Food and Drink is available from our General Store.

## **SCRS-ANNUAL PIONEER RALLY**

On the LAST WEEKEND IN JULY each year the SCRS holds its largest display of the year. The event showcases the activities of the SCRS and other organisations which share Heritage Park with us. We charge a small entry fee for Adults to raise funds so we may fund our Society activities and maintain Heritage Park.
